Director's Corner

Fall is the season for pumpkin spice, raking leaves, and non-profit annual appeals!

The focus of our <u>Annual Appeal</u> changes from year to year. Last year's campaign supported the **strategic plan**, so your gifts went towards teen programs, Sunday hours, and our new online calendar/event registration system. The year before, all of the proceeds were used to create a new **Endowment Fund**. This year, <u>every dollar you give</u> in response to the <u>2016 Annual Appeal</u> will go towards hiring an **architect** to help us plan

for interior renovations.

With a generous \$1,000 gift from the Lower Moreland Business
Association, we are off to a great start. As Pam likes to say...we just need 29 more of those to reach our \$30,000 goal. I am going to be wildly optimistic and predict that we reach it by December 31. If we don't, we will continue to fundraise until we do...and then hire the architect. (We are already planning the next Author Brunch.)

Renovations we know we need include: new flooring, replacing leaking windows (we have wet carpet after each rain storm), new blinds, refinishing or replacing worn furniture, replacing light fixtures to conserve electricity, replacing broken doors, installing motion-activated faucets to conserve water, and replacing the Circulation desk. We also hope to tackle acoustics, crowding around the computers, and that mess of desks and book carts we call the staff workroom. Other, more costly ideas that we want to explore with the architect include creating study rooms and perhaps building a walled-off quiet reading and study area.

This is a beautiful building in a lovely location and a terrific place to spend time. With your support, we can plan for these much-needed renovations to ensure the Huntingdon Valley Library remains a comfortable community hub for the next 20 years. Consider giving today. -Sharon
