

- **April 6 - Montgomery County's Pennypack Trail and an Unnatural History of the Pennypack Preserve** with Dr. David Robertson, Executive Director, [Pennypack Ecological Restoration Trust](#).



Though the Pennypack Trail winds through some of the most dramatic wooded scenery in Montgomery County, the landscape is hardly natural despite its deep forest cover. For centuries, European colonists and their descendants have modified the Pennypack Creek valley in ways that are sometimes obvious and sometimes subtle, but the evidence is apparent everywhere.

Dr. David Robertson, Executive Director of the Pennypack Ecological Restoration Trust, will lead a virtual tour of the trail and highlight features of the adjacent Pennypack Preserve that record man's influence, including a disappearing island, artificial rapids, a long-forgotten distillery, and more.


