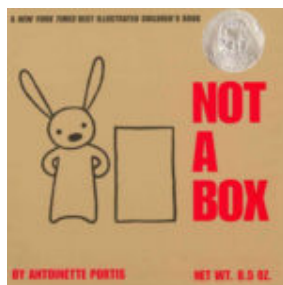

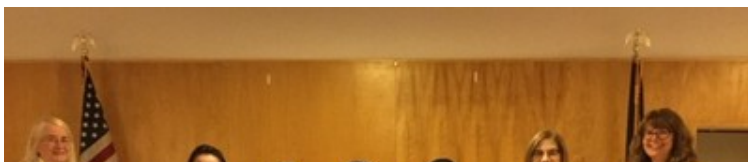

Director's Corner

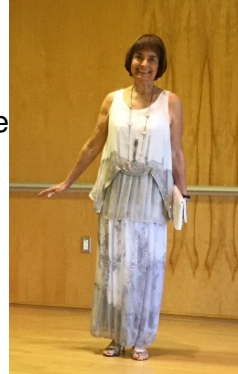
Volunteer Appreciation!
