

I hope everyone received the Annual Appeal email on October 19 - and my apologies for the **DONATION button** malfunction! <u>*Try here...*</u>




If you are one of our 350 active donors (THANK YOU!), watch the mail for your colorful brochure (complete with pictures of very cute children) and self-addressed envelope.


