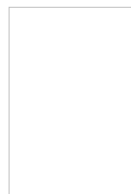
- **Teen Craft Night - Painting with Kathleen -**

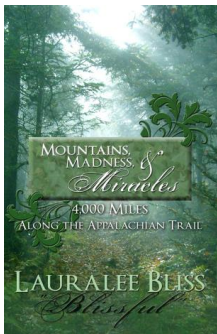

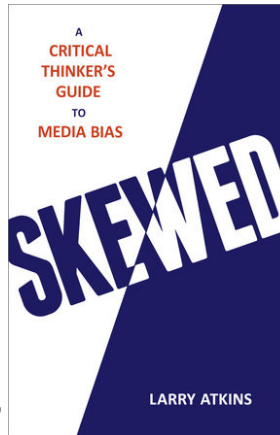

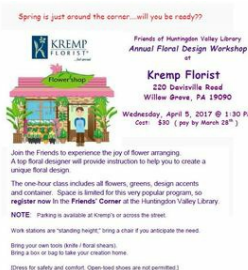
