


## Online Catalog Updates of note.

Overnight on Wednesday, June 12, MCLINC updated our online catalog to the newest version and you may notice a few changes and improvements.

You can now **place individual holds** on the edition of your choice for travel guides and other books published annual (serials, journals, magazines, etc.). There is a little icon with an arrow (circled below) that you click to select the exact copy you want. Explore everything in the collection by clicking the "see items from all branches" link. You may see this with some graphic novels, too.
