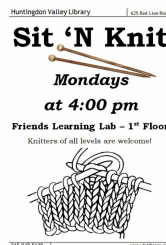

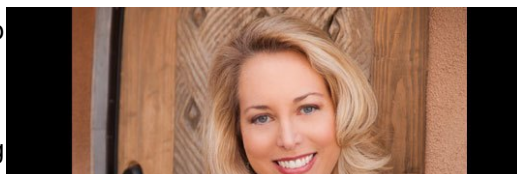


Director's Corner:

These are all labels that apply to author Valerie Plame, who will be the featured speaker at the Huntington Valley Library spring



author brunch and fundraiser on
April 10, 2016 at 11 am at

After her identity as a covert CIA operative was outed by senior White House officials in 2003, Plame resigned from the Agency and wrote her best-selling memoir, *Fair Game: My Life as a Spy, My Betrayal by the White House*. The book became a motion picture by the same title in 2010 and starred Sean Penn and Naomi Watts.

The cost is \$60 and includes a full brunch and omelet bar, valet parking and the knowledge you are helping support the Huntingdon Valley Library's mission to provide a vibrant welcoming environment where everyone will engage, explore and enjoy. All Plame titles, including *Fair Game* and *Burned* and *Blowback* from her spy thriller series will be available for sale and signing at the brunch.

Invitations are going out to several special guests and local celebrities and there will be a limited-ticket "VIP Meet and Greet" opportunity at 10 am, before the general admission. The first 50 people who purchase these special tickets (at \$160 each total), are able to meet Plame before brunch doors open, to get their books personalized and pose for photographs.
