Fair to say good bye to Miss Glynnis.

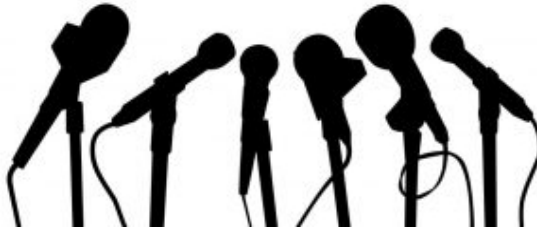
